## Executive Summary: Statement of Financial Condition – January 31, 2024

- On an accrual basis, interim financials show that CCH ended January with a \$62.7M favorable variance to budget. On a cash basis, the County's preliminary cash report on revenues and expenses shows a \$113.1M favorable variance to budget. Differences in accrual versus cash basis are primarily due to the timing difference related to recording of revenues received and expenses paid.
  - Revenue Commentary:
    - Favorable NPSR variance to Budget due to higher than budgeted OP volumes/revenues
    - Favorable capitation variance to Budget due to higher than budgeted CountyCare membership
  - Expenditures:
    - CountyCare claims unfavorable variance to budget due to higher than budgeted membership

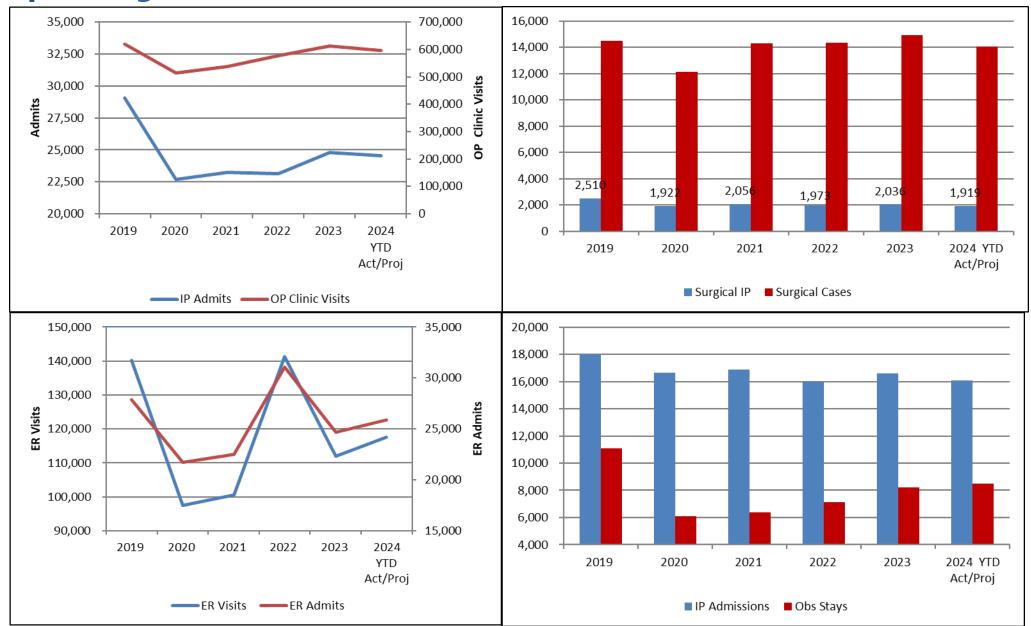

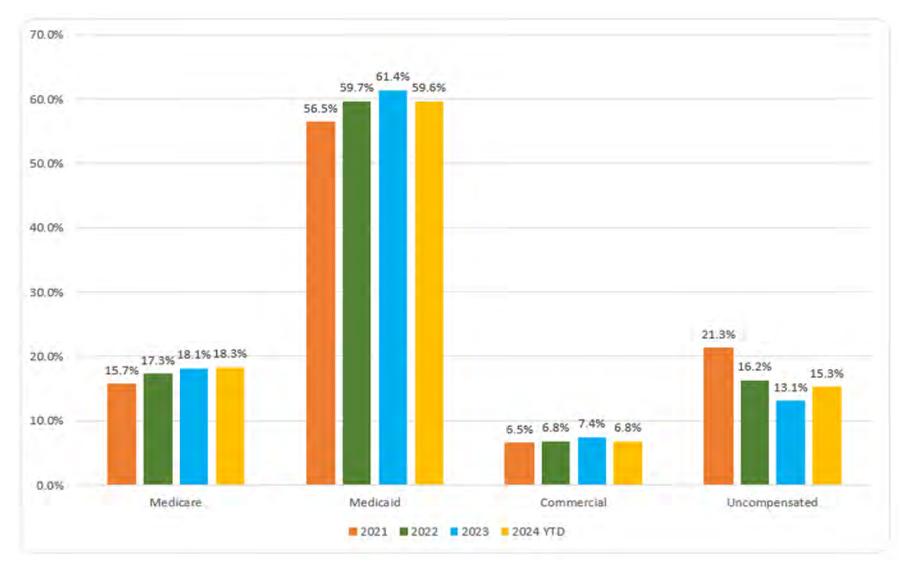

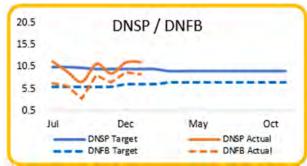

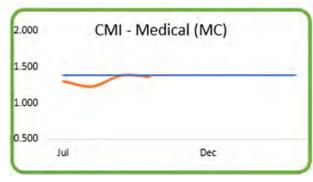
## Revenue Cycle KPI Trending

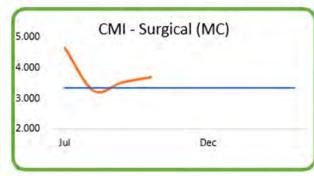

**DNSP:** Discharged Not Submitted to Payer - Gross dollars from initial 837 claims held by edits in claims processing tool that have not been sent to payer.

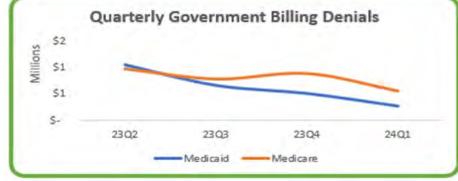

Refers to accounts in suspense (within bill hold days) and pending final billed status in the patient accounting system.

**CMI:** Case Mix Index - Represents the average diagnosis-related group (DRG) relative weight for that hospital. It is calculated by summing the DRG weights for all Medicare discharges and dividing by the number of discharges.

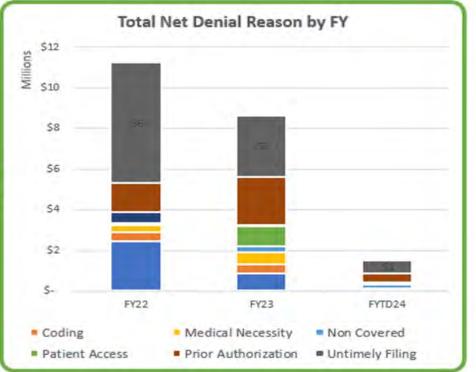

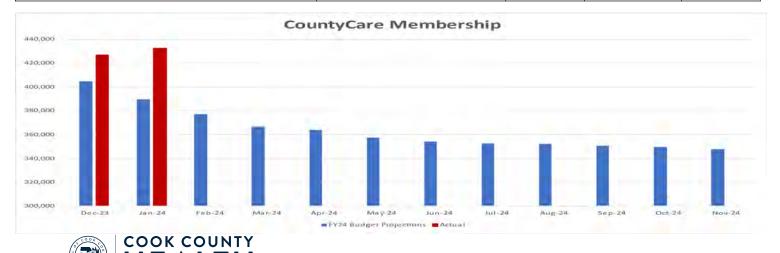
