Attending Physician XII (Pediatric Radiologist)

Job Summary

The Attending Physician XII-Pediatric Radiologist is responsible for the supervision of and interpretation of pediatric imaging studies obtained within the department of radiology and hospital system. The Attending Physician XII-Pediatric Radiologist is responsible to help ensure the continued provision of quality pediatric imaging examinations and interventions for patients in the health system. This position is for, but not limited to, the area of pediatric imaging. Experience must be wide and varied.

Typical Duties

- Follows departmental and hospital policies
- Interprets radiologic studies in a timely manner
- Reviews dictation of final reports for studies reviewed in a timely manner
- Maintains continued productivity related to assigned duties
- Supervises Radiology residents and technologist when appropriate
- Reviews Radiology residents' preliminary reports in a timely manner; reviews and corrects Radiology residents preliminary reports, as necessary
- Participates in the education of residents, including didactic lecture preparation
- Provides radiologic consultative services for other clinical departments within Cook County Health (CCH)
- Participates in multidisciplinary conferences as assigned
- Performs procedures in areas where clinical privileges are granted
- Provides coverage to the various areas of the department and hospital system as requested by the Chair
- Takes calls as assigned by the department chair including remote review of studies
- Participates in departmental and/or system wide quality improvements/assurance efforts as assigned
- Maintains an educational environment conducive to educating the residents
- Helps coordinate pediatric imaging services throughout the system and unify protocols related to performing pediatric imaging examinations at the multiple sites
- Evaluates and participates in designing specifications for new equipment or services for pediatric patients
- Oversees and maintains continued safety and quality assurance programs specific to the area of pediatric imaging
- Oversees and maintains accreditation of services in pediatric imaging
- Performs other duties as assigned

Minimum Qualifications

- Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) or Doctor of Osteopathy Medicine (D.O.) from an accredited college or university



Minimum Qualifications

- Licensed physician in the State of Illinois, or have the ability to obtain licensure prior to the start of employment
- Successful completion of an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited Diagnostic Radiology Residency
- Certified by the American Board of Radiology OR if currently in Fellowship training, passed Step I Board Examination by the American Board of Radiology. Must become certified after completion of practice requirements stipulated by the ABR to maintain recommendation for remaining on the medical staff
- Currently enrolled in or has completed fellowship training in Pediatric Radiology OR equivalent practice experience deemed acceptable
- Appropriate experience for clinical privileges
- Must be able to interpret US, CT and MRI examinations as well as general X-ray

Preferred Qualifications

- Certificate of Added Qualification in Pediatric Radiology from the American Board of Radiology
- Extra training (mini fellowship) during residency in Pediatric Radiology
- Demonstrated prior leadership experience
- Demonstrated of dedication to training Residents or Fellows in Radiology
- Recent (within the last 36 months) diagnostic radiology research of publishable scholarly activity
- Selection of Diagnostic Radiology Chief Resident in an ACGME approved Diagnostic Radiology Residency Program
- Activities demonstrating service to public health or underserved populations

Knowledge, Skills, Abilities and Other Characteristics

- Working knowledge and experience with all aspects of general Radiology
- Working knowledge and experience with interpretation of pediatric imaging studies
- Knowledge of the principles and methods of training medical staff to ensure standards of care
- Skill to analyze data/information accurately in order to determine and implement an effective and appropriate course of action
- Skill to prepare written documents to provide information and/or direction to staff and others.
- Skill to communicate effectively in order to exchange and/or provide information and/or direction to staff and others
- Demonstrate the ability to follow department specific work rules, hospital and personnel rules.
- Demonstrate attention to detail, accuracy and precision in decision making.
- Ability to adhere to department policies and standards utilizing best practices and the appropriate use of the electronic health record (EHR)
- Ability to maintain a professional demeanor and composure when challenged.
- Ability to follow hospital protocol when exposed to noise, chemicals, disease, blood borne

pathogens, patient violence and procedural injuries

- Ability to work flexible hours including weekends, evenings and holidays as needed.
- Must be able to travel to work sites throughout Cook County
- Ability to meet department and divisional productivity thresholds
- Ability to meet appropriate confidentiality standards for protected health information (PHI)
- Ability to provide appropriate patient care while maintaining fiduciary responsibility to patients
- Ability to demonstrate service to public health or underserved populations

Physical and Environmental Demands
