build a modern and efficient inpatient and outpatient facility on a vacant parcel immediately west of and adjacent to the current Provident Hospital, which is located at 500 E. 51 st St.,

Chicago. The new facility will include a smaller replacement hospital with 42 medical/surgical beds and six ICU beds; eight operating suites as well as 70 outpatient exam rooms for the provision of comprehensive outpatient primary and specialty

On October 22, the Illinois Health Facilities & Services Review Board approved Cook County Health's Certificate of Need to

care. There will also be laboratory, diagnostic, dental, behavioral health and pharmacy services. A comprehensive emergency department with 18 bays is also planned. The new eight-story facility will cost approximately \$240 million. The debt service on the new facility will be paid for by the health system through patient revenues not local tax dollars.

In addition to the expansion of high-quality inpatient and outpatient services, the new Provident facility is expected to maintain 450 full-time jobs and add as many as 90 new jobs when it is fully operational. The building of this replacement hospital is part of CCH's strategic plan, IMPACT 2020, which laid out two critical strategies - the long overdue need to update, upgrade and even rebuild

facilities to ensure that CCH is providing state-of-the-art care to its patients and the need to attract new, insured patients to ensure CCH can remain true to its historic mission. CCH recently opened a new outpatient facility on its central campus as well as a new community health center in Arlington Heights. In 2020, new community health centers will open in North

Riverside, Blue Island and in Chicago's Belmont-Cragin neighborhood.

With these project we are coming closer to realizing our future as a modern, integrated personcentered health system, providing expert care while fulfilling our historical mission to care for all. Sincerely.

The National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) released their 2019-2020 Health Insurance Plan Ratings, ranking Cook County Health's CountyCare, the system's Medicaid managed care plan, as one of the top-rated Medicaid plans in Illinois. Plans are scored on a scale of o to 5, with ratings measuring quality of care and patient

"This recognition is a testament to our team and our model of care that provides comprehensive services and emphasizes provider-based care coordination designed to improve health outcomes." CountyCare is the largest Medicaid managed care plan in Cook County with 320,000 members. CountyCare covers prescription drugs, primary and specialty care, laboratory and X-ray services.

CountyCare also scored the highest in the state for preventive care and treatment, and tied for

satisfaction. Overall, CountyCare tied for the top rating in Illinois, with a score of 3.5.






